

## Calendula Extract

### Specification Sheet

**Description:** Calendula officinalis (also called common marigold) is widely cultivated and can be grown easily in sunny locations in most kinds of soils. Carotenoids are the source of the yellow-orange coloration. Dissolved in a base glycerin and water.

**INCI Name:** Glycerin, Water, Calendula Officinalis Flower Extract

**Composition:** Glycerin, Water, Calendula Officinalis Flower Extract, Phenoxyethanol

**Appearance:** Medium to dark amber liquid, characteristic odor

**Benefits:**

- Contains high levels of calendic acid in the seeds while the petals and pollen contain triterpenoid esters and the carotenoids flavoxanthin and auroxanthin
- Effective soothing and moisturizing properties
- Especially suitable for the sensitive and irritated skin

**Use:** Add to formulas to the water phase. Typical use level 5 - 10%. For external use only

**Applications:** Serums, creams & lotions, skin cleansers, sun- and after-sun care, sunscreens, face & hair masks.

**Solubility:** Water-soluble

**Preservation:** Phenoxyethanol

**Storage:** Store in a closed container at a dry place at room temperature.

**Raw material source:** Calendula Officinalis (Calendula), glycerin made of naturally derived oils

**Manufacture:** Created from macerated material and extracted with water to yield a concentrate, then dissolved in glycerin at a concentration of 20% concentrate and 80% diluents
